

Chapter Ind 69

FEE SCHEDULE

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**History:** Chapter Ind 69 as it existed on April 30, 1968 was repealed and a new chapter Ind 69 was created, Register, April, 1968, No. 148, effective May 1, 1968.

**Ind 69.01 Scope.** The fees fixed in this code shall be assessed and collected by the department of industry, labor and human relations for the inspection of boilers, unfired pressure vessels, and refrigeration plants for the examination and certification of boiler and elevator inspectors employed by insurance companies; for the examination and approval of building plans and component parts of buildings, for plan examination and the inspection of elevators, power dumb-waiters, escalators, moving walks, moving ramps and personnel hoists and for all other services for which authority to fix and collect fees is provided in section 101.10 (12) and (13), Wis. Stats.

**Ind 69.015 Payment of fees.** All checks covering payment of fees determined by the following fee schedules are to be made payable to the Division of Industrial Safety and Buildings and mailed to the State of Wisconsin, Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations, P. O. Box 2209, Madison, Wisconsin 53701.

**Ind 69.02 Boiler inspections.** (1) For the purpose of determining the inspection fee, a boiler shall be rated at 10 square feet of heating surface per horsepower.

(2) Inspection fees shall be assessed and collected in accordance with this schedule:

(a) 3 H.P. and less.....	None	\$ 5.00	\$ 5.00
(b) 4 H.P. to 10 H.P.....	\$12.00	12.00	7.50
(c) 11 H.P. to 25 H.P.....	17.50	17.50	12.50
(d) 26 H.P. to 100 H.P.....	25.00	25.00	15.00
(e) Over 100 H.P.....	40.00	40.00	25.00

**Ind 69.03 Unfired pressure vessel inspections.** (1) For the purpose of determining the inspection fee, the size of an unfired pressure vessel shall be its cubic content in terms of cubic feet.

(2) Inspection fees shall be assessed and collected in accordance with this schedule:

Volume In Cubic Feet	Internal Inspection	Hydrostatic Test	External Inspection
(a) 1 to 50.....	\$ 5.00	\$10.00	\$ 3.00
(b) 51 to 200.....	7.50	15.00	5.00
(c) Over 200.....	15.00	20.00	7.50

(3) The minimum fee to be assessed for a single external inspection of a vessel shall be \$5.00.

**Ind 69.04 Wisconsin special vessel plan examinations and approvals.**

(1) Plans showing design and construction details, design computations and specifications for materials for any one boiler or unfired pressure vessel submitted for examination and approval according to Wis. Adm. Code chapter 41, section Ind 41.51 shall be accompanied by a fee in the amount determined by subsection (2).✓

(2) Plan examination and approval fees shall be assessed and collected in accordance with this schedule:

Capacity in Cubic Feet	Cost Per Plan
(a) 1 to 25.....	\$ 5.00
(b) Over 25 to 50.....	10.00
(c) Over 50.....	15.00

**Ind 69.05 Department certificate of operation.** The department of industry, labor and human relations shall issue a certificate of operation for each boiler or refrigeration system or one and more unfired pressure vessels as covered in Wis. Adm. Code chapter 41 section Ind 41.28 upon receipt of an inspection report showing the equipment satisfies minimum operating standards specified in chapters 41 and 45. A fee of \$3.00 shall be assessed the owner for the issuance of each certificate of operation.

**Ind 69.06 Refrigeration plant inspections.** (1) For the purpose of assessing the inspection fee, the capacity of a refrigeration plant shall be determined in tons. One ton of refrigeration capacity shall be the equivalent of abstracting heat at the rate of 12,000 BTU per hour.

(2) Inspection fees shall be assessed and collected in accordance with this schedule:

(a) Less than 3.....	Exempt
(b) 3 to 25.....	\$ 7.50
(c) 26 to 100.....	10.00
(d) 101 to 250.....	15.00
(e) 251 to 500.....	20.00
(f) Over 500.....	30.00

**Ind 69.07 Registration fee.** The installing contractor of each mechanical refrigeration system that must be registered according to Wis. Adm. Code chapter 45, section Ind 45.20 shall be assessed \$1. fee per system.

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**Ind 69.10 Plan examinations and approvals.** (1) Plans showing design and construction details, design computations, and specifications submitted for examination and approval as required by Wis. Adm. Code chapters Ind 20, 46 and 50 through 59 shall be accompanied by a fee in the amount determined by subsection (3).

(2) For the purpose of arriving at the examination and approval fee for building plans and for heating and ventilation plans, the size of a building shall be the total cubical volume determined by the overall outside dimensions of length, width and height.

(3) Plan examination and approval fees for the listed types of construction shall be assessed and collected as follows:

(a) General building plans.....	30¢ per 1,000 cubic feet Minimum fee—\$12.00 per plan
(b) Heating and ventilation plans.....	20¢ per 1,000 cubic feet Minimum fee—\$6.00 per plan
(c) Plans for each tramway installation per Wis. Adm. Code chapter 46, section Ind 46.03.....	\$20.00
(d) Miscellaneous plans:	
1. Stadia, grandstands and bleachers.....	\$6.00 per 1,000 seats or fraction of 1,000 seats
2. Structures, when submitted separately from general building plans.....	\$11.00 per structure
3. Fire escapes—plans submitted by fabricator....	\$6.00 per fire escape
4. Industrial exhaust systems for dusts, fumes, vapors, gases and spray coating.....	\$6.00 per system
5. Alterations and repairs for buildings and structures.....	\$1.10 for every \$1,000 or fraction of \$1,000 estimated costs. Minimum fee—\$6.00. (Estimate need not include costs of razing, plumbing, electrical, painting or decorating.)
(4) Micro-film prints (approved plans reproduced from micro-film).....	\$2.50 per sheet—1-5 sheets \$2.00 per sheet—6 or more sheets

**Ind 69.20 Elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, moving ramps and personnel hoists; plan examinations and approvals.**

(1) Plans for elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, moving ramps, and personnel hoists shall be submitted for each installation in compliance with Wis. Adm. Code section Ind 4.04, (elevators); and Wis. Adm. Code section Ind 44.01 (personnel hoists).

(2) The plan examination and approval fee for each installation shall be assessed and collected as outlined in this schedule.

(a) Elevators (includes passenger, freight, material handling, power chain, and cable hoist)...	5/10 of 1% of cost—minimum fee—\$20.00
(b) Power dumbwaiters.....	5/10 of 1% of cost—minimum fee—\$20.00
(c) Escalators.....	5/10 of 1% of cost—minimum fee—\$20.00
(d) Moving walks.....	5/10 of 1% of cost—minimum fee—\$20.00
(e) Moving ramps.....	5/10 of 1% of cost—minimum fee—\$20.00
(f) Personnel hoists.....	5/10 of 1% of cost—minimum fee—\$20.00

**Ind 69.25 Elevators, power dumbwaiters, escalators, moving walks, moving ramps and personnel hoists inspections.** (1) An inspection fee shall be assessed and collected for each installation of a passenger, freight and material handling elevator, personnel hoist, power dumb-

waiter, escalator, moving walk and moving ramp as classified in this schedule.

(a) <i>Class 1.</i> Freight elevators (single belt, double belt and cable control elevators) with 4 landings or less, sidewalk elevators, sidewalk type elevators and grade level elevators.....	\$15.00
1. Plus each additional landing.....	2.00
(b) <i>Class 2.</i> Passenger and all other freight elevators not in class 1 with 4 landings or less.....	15.00
1. Plus each additional landing.....	2.00
(c) <i>Class 3.</i> Material handling elevators with 2 landings or less.....	15.00
1. Plus each additional landing.....	2.00
(d) <i>Class 4.</i> Personnel hoists.....	15.00
(e) <i>Class 5.</i> Hand power elevators.....	8.00
(f) <i>Class 6.</i> Dumbwaiters—power with 4 landings or less.....	10.00
1. Plus each additional landing.....	1.00
(g) <i>Class 7.</i> Escalators, moving walks and moving ramps per unit.....	15.00
1. A single section having a travel of one floor defines an escalator unit.	

**Note:** Any elevator or dumbwaiter classification may be identified by number of landings. Example: 6 landing passenger elevator would be classified as Class 2—6.

**Ind 69.30 Shop inspections.** (1) Inspection of boilers, pressure vessels, elevators, dumbwaiters, moving ramps, personnel hoists and similar devices, and parts of such devices, may be provided at reasonable times at the place of manufacture on request, but only when deemed by the department of industry, labor and human relations to be essential and necessary.

(2) Fees to be assessed and collected for shop inspections shall be as follows:

- (a) One inspector's services..... \$90.00 per 8-hour day
1. For services requiring less than 8 hours in any one day, the fee shall be \$12.00 per hour.
  2. Additional charges shall be assessed and collected for necessary expenses incurred by the inspector for travel, including mileage, meals and lodging. Travel expenses shall be limited to those allowable under department employe travel regulations.

**Ind 69.50 Certificates of competency.** (1) Insurance company employees eligible in accordance with the provisions of the applicable administrative code, to be examined for competency as a boiler inspector or as an elevator inspector shall submit with the proper application forms an examination fee of \$25.00.

- (a) Boiler inspectors receiving a reciprocal "certificate of competency" by qualifying as a member of the "National Board of Boiler and Unfired Pressure Vessel Inspectors" shall submit with their application form a fee of \$25.00.
- (b) An applicant who fails the scheduled examination need not submit an additional examination fee when application for reexamination is filed within 12 months from the date of the previous examination.

(2) The annual renewal fee for certificates of competency shall be \$5.00.
