Ind 69.001 Scope. The fees established in the following sections of this chapter shall be paid to the department of industry, labor and human relations for providing those services authorized in the Wisconsin Statutes.

Note: All checks or money orders are to be made payable to Wisconsin Department of Industry, Labor and Human Relations.

Ind 69.002 Saving and severable clauses. If, for any reason, any one or more sections, sentences, clauses or parts of this chapter are held invalid, such invalidity shall not affect, impair or invalidate the remaining provisions.

- 1. Exceptions. a. Warehouses. The fees for plan examination of warehouses shall be determined in accordance with par. (a) (intro.) except that the fee may be reduced by 30%. The minimum fee shall be \$75.00.
- b. Replacement of heating equipment. The fee for the approval of the replacement of a furnace in an existing heating system with no alterations to the heating system shall be \$27.00. See s. Ind 69.03 (5) for registration fee for boilers and pressure vessels.
- (b) Permit to start construction. The fee for a permit to start construction shall be \$75.00 per permit.
- (c) Building alterations. The examination fees for alteration plans of existing buildings and structures undergoing remodeling or review of tenant space layouts shall be computed on the basis of 2 cents per gross square foot of the floor area, roof areas and external wall surfaces undergoing remodeling. The minimum fee shall be \$75.00.
- 1. The fee specified in par. (c) (intro.) shall be based on the actual gross square footage of the area being remodeled. When the remodeling of an individual building element affects the compliance of the code for the entire area, the examination fee shall be computed on the basis of the total square footage of the affected area.
- 2. Where the total plan examination fee calculated under par. (c) (intro.) exceeds that determined under par. (a), the examination fee may be determined under the requirements specified in par. (a).
- 3. Where heating, ventilating and air conditioning alterations are submitted with the building alteration plans, no separate examination fee shall be required for the heating, ventilating and air conditioning plan remodeling.
- 4. Where heating, ventilating and air conditioning alteration plans are submitted separately from the building alteration plans, the examination fees shall be computed on the basis of \$3.24 per \$1,000 cost of the alteration. The minimum fee shall be \$75.00.
- (d) Revisions. The fee for revisions to previously examined plans is \$75.00 per plan. This paragraph applies when plans are revised for reasons other than those that were requested by the department.
- (e) Footing and foundation plans. The fee for a footing and foundation plan submitted separately is \$108.00 per plan.
- (f) Structural plans. The fees for the examination and approval of structural plans shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.09-2. Trusses, precast concrete, laminated wood beams, and other structural elements, when submitted separately and not included with general building plans, shall comply with this paragraph.

⁽⁷⁾ INSPECTION AND COPYING OF PLANS AND SPECIFICATIONS. The department shall allow inspection and copying of all plans, specifications and related materials filed with the department, except as follows:

- (c) Prior to any inspection or copying of plans, specifications and related materials, a written, signed application shall be obtained from the person requesting the inspection or copying. The application shall contain a general description of the premises for which inspection or copying is requested and the full name and address of the requester. The written request shall contain a statement that any information obtained from the inspection or copying shall not be used for any unlawful purpose or unfair competitive practice, and that the information set out therein is true and correct. The department will consider the information supplied in the request in conjunction with the type of buildings noted in par. (a) in determining whether the request for inspection or copying shall be granted. The department shall promptly transmit a copy of this statement to the owner and submittor of the documents being inspected or copied.
- (d) The department may charge a reasonable amount to defray its costs in providing copies.

- c. Determine fee based on Table 69.23-1 1.
- 2. Building water distribution system. a. Total all of the water supply fixture units that are being added or relocated, using s. H 62.13 [ILHR 82.13] Table 13, and convert to gallons per minute (GPM) in accordance with s. H 62.13 [ILHR 82.13] Table 14.
- b. The fees shall be determined in accordance with GPM demand of the new or relocated fixtures as specified in Table 69.23-2.

3. Building storm sewer and drainage system. a. Total all of the roof area that the new or relocated roof drains serve. For added or relocated clear water drains inside the building receiving continuous or semicontinuous discharge into the building storm drain, each gallon per minute (GPM) of discharge shall be computed as 26 square feet of roof area.

- b. Refer to s. H 62.12 [ILHR 82.12] Table 11, the column for %" pitch, and determine the horizontal drain size that would be required if all new or relocated fixtures discharged through one pipe. Use this pipe size for determining the fee.
 - c. Determine the fee based on Table 69.23-1 5.
- (d) Priority plan review. An appointment may be made with the department to facilitate the examination of plans in less than the normal processing time. The plans shall comply with the provisions of s. H 62.25 [ILHR 82.25]. Delivery of the plans for priority plan review shall be made in person. The fee for this type of plan examination shall be determined at twice the normal rate.
- (e) Reproduction fee. If the correct number of plans or specifications have not been submitted, a minimum reproduction fee of \$7.00 per set shall be charged except that reproductions exceeding \$7.00 per set shall be charged actual costs. Reproduction fees shall be charged to the party submitting the plans.
- (f) Plan approval additional copies. Approval for sets of plans in excess of 3 sets shall be provided upon receipt of a fee of \$10.00 plus \$3.50 per plan sheet.
- (g) Revisions. The fee for revisions to previously examined plans shall be \$20.00 per plan. This fee applies when plans are revised for reasons other than those that were requested by the department.
- (h) Projects without approval. The fees specified in pars. (b) to (g) shall be doubled for those projects for which the installation of plumbing has started without department approval.
- (2) PRIVATE SEWAGE PLAN EXAMINATION FEES. (a) General. Plan examination fees for preliminary or complete plans shall accompany the plans and specifications when submitted. If the department determines upon review of the plans that inadequate fees were provided, the necessary additional fee shall be provided prior to departmental approval. Written approval shall not be granted until all applicable fees have been paid.
- (b) Examination fees. The plan examination fee shall be determined in accordance with Table 69.23-3.

- (c) Priority plan review. An appointment may be made with the department to facilitate the examination of plans in less than the normal processing time. The plans shall comply with the provisions of s. H63.08 [ILHR 83.08]. Delivery of the plans for priority plan review shall be made in person. The fee for this type of plan examination shall be determined at twice the normal rate.
- (d) Reproduction fee. If the correct number of plans or specifications have not been submitted, a minimum reproduction fee of \$7.00 per set shall be charged except that reproductions exceeding \$7.00 per set shall be charged actual costs. Reproduction fees shall be charged to the party submitting the plans.
- (e) Revisions. The fee for revisions to previously examined plans shall be \$20.00 per plan. This fee applies when plans are revised for reasons other than those that were requested by the department.
- (f) Projects without approvals. The fees specified in pars. (b) to (e) shall be doubled for those projects for which the installation of plumbing has started without department approval.

- (4) MISCELLANEOUS SERVICES. When the department provides goods or services not specifically covered in this section, fees may be charged to organizations requesting such goods and services.

Ind 69.24 Rental unit energy efficiency program. Pursuant to s. 101.19 (1) (i), Stats., the fees to administer and enforce s. 101.122, Stats., are as follows:

- (1) Transfer authorization number stamps. A fee of \$10.00 shall be remitted to the department for each DILHR transfer authorization number stamp used to authorize certificates of compliance, stipulations and waivers.
- (2) APPLICATIONS FOR EXEMPTION. A fee of \$10.00 shall be remitted to the department when an application for exemption is submitted to the department.
- (3) APPLICATIONS FOR STIPULATION. A fee of \$20.00 shall be remitted to the department when an application for stipulation is submitted to the department.
- (4) APPLICATION FOR WAIVER. A fee of \$20.00 shall be remitted to the department when an application for waiver is submitted to the department.
- (5) APPLICATION FOR CERTIFICATION. (a) Maximum fee. The maximum fee for inspection and certification of rental units by the department, authorizing municipality or any certified inspector, shall be as follows:
 - 1. Up to 2 Rental Units......\$200
- (b) Scope of fee. The inspection and certification fee shall cover the cost of performing an initial inspection, issuance of the certificate, notification of noncompliance, inspections to secure compliance and a final inspection for determining compliance. If after an initial inspection, a notice of noncompliance is issued and upon reinspection the unit has not been brought into compliance, the inspector may charge an additional fee to offset the cost of further inspection. Any additional inspection required shall be charged on an actual cost basis including salary and actual travel expenses. If after an initial inspection, a notice of non-compliance is issued and upon reinspection all the required energy measures were installed, no additional charges may be made for any further inspections. Further inspections may be necessary to assure that the proper energy measures are installed in response to any additional points of non-compliance.
