

the written certification of the owner or transferor required by subsection (2). Such records shall include the following information:

(a) The name and address of each person from whom feeder pigs were purchased or received; the number purchased or received; the official ear tag numbers of all such pigs; and the date and place of receipt of such pigs.

(b) The name and address of all persons to whom feeder pigs were sold or delivered; the number of pigs sold or delivered; and the date of the transaction. The filing of reports may be required on forms approved by the department.

(5) No dealer or market operator shall sell or transfer possession of any feeder pigs, other than to another dealer or market operator, unless such pigs are accompanied by an official health certificate. Official health certificates shall be valid for a period of 72 hours. Official health certificates and interstate health certificates shall be executed by a veterinarian and shall include a statement that all feeder pigs covered by such certificates are identified by official ear tags and are free from evidence of infectious or communicable disease.

(6) Failure to comply with the provisions of this section shall be grounds for revocation of any license issued under section 95.70, Wis. Stats.
