## EXCLUSION LIST OF CONDITIONS THAT ARE NOT REPORTABLE\*

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List of isolated defects considered normal variants when found in isolation

Accessory auricle (drop ear tags)	Nasal lacrimal duct obstruction
Accessory nipple (supernumerary nipple, or skin tag)	Natal teeth
Cervical rib	Overriding sutures
Clinodactyly (incurving of 5th finger)	Phimosis
Cryptorchidism (see undescended testicle)	Polydactyly in blacks (Postaxial, Type B)
Diastasis recti	Posteriorly rotated ears
Epicanthal folds	Rectal fissures
Esotropia	Redundant foreskin
Flammeus nevus	Single umbilical artery
Flat bridge of nose	Syndactyly of 2nd and 3rd toe
Fontanelle (large or small)	Thymic hypertrophy
Gum cysts, including congenital epulis, ranula, mucocele	Tibial torsion
Hemangioma	Tongue tie
Hemolytic disease of the newborn (RH disease)	Umbilical cord atrophy
Hydroceles	Umbilical hernias (completely covered by skin)
Hymenal tags	Undescended testicle or cryptorchidism if birth weight is less than 2500 grams
Hypoplastic scrotum (if birth weight is less than 2,500 grams)	Vaginal cysts
Incurving fingers (clinodactyly)	Vaginal tags
Long fingers and toes	Webbing of neck
Low set ears	Widely spaced nipples
Meckel's diverticulum	
Mongolian spots
