



**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 14,
TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 2,
TO 1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 37**

February 16, 1995 – Offered by Representative LORGE.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

2 **1.** Page 1, line 5: after “law” insert “, officers and staffing of legislative party
3 caucuses, legislative committee clerks”.

4 **2.** Page 11, line 3: after that line insert:

5 “SECTION 18e. 13.195 of the statutes is created to read:

6 **13.195 Party caucuses.** The members of each political party in each house
7 of the legislature shall select a member to serve as caucus chairperson. Each caucus
8 chairperson may employ one person under s. 13.20 (1) to serve as caucus director.
9 The position of caucus director shall be assigned to a pay range that is comparable
10 to the pay range to which committee clerks are assigned.

11 **SECTION 18f.** 13.20 (1) and (2) of the statutes are amended to read:

12 **13.20 (1) NUMBER AND PAY RANGE OF LEGISLATIVE EMPLOYEES.** The legislature or
13 either house thereof may employ under the unclassified service such policy research
14 personnel, assistants to legislators, research staff assigned to legislative committees
15 and party caucuses and such clerical, professional or other assistants as in the

1 judgment of the joint committee on legislative organization or the committee on
2 organization in each house are necessary to enable it to perform its functions and
3 duties and to best serve the people of this state. In addition, each caucus chairperson
4 may employ one individual to serve as caucus director under s. 13.195.

5 (2) PAY RANGES; DURATION OF EMPLOYMENT. All Except as provided in s. 13.195,
6 all legislative employes shall be paid in accordance with the compensation and
7 classification plan for employes in the classified civil service within ranges approved
8 by the joint committee on legislative organization. The secretary of employment
9 relations shall make recommendations concerning a compensation and classification
10 schedule for legislative employes if requested to do so by the joint committee on
11 legislative organization or by the committee on organization of either house. If the
12 joint committee does not approve pay ranges for legislative employes, the committee
13 on organization of either house may approve pay ranges for its employes.
14 Appointments shall be made for the legislative session, unless earlier terminated by
15 the appointing officer.

16 **SECTION 18g.** 13.45 (8) of the statutes is created to read:

17 13.45 (8) CLERK. The joint committee on legislative organization, for joint
18 standing committees, and the committee on organization of each house, for standing
19 committees of that house, shall assign a committee clerk, who shall keep the records
20 of the committee.”.

21 **3.** Page 11, line 10: after that line insert:

22 **“SECTION 19w. Nonstatutory provisions; position deauthorizations.**
