



**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 3,
TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO 1995 ASSEMBLY BILL 774**

March 25, 1996 - Offered by Representatives HUBLER, BOYLE and MUSSER.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

2 **1.** Page 2, line 8: after that line insert:

3 “(3t) SEIZURE OF VIDEO POKER MACHINES. Notwithstanding section 66.051 (1) (b)
4 of the statutes, no board or council of any city, village or town may cause the seizure
5 of any video gaming device commonly known as a video poker machine or cause the
6 destruction of any such thing on or after the effective date of this subsection but
7 before July 1, 1998. Notwithstanding sections 968.13 (1) (a) and 968.20 (2) of the
8 statutes, a video gaming device commonly known as a video poker machine that is
9 seized pursuant to a search warrant or seized without a search warrant is not
10 contraband and shall be returned as provided under section 968.20 (1) of the
11 statutes.”.
