**ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO 2001 ASSEMBLY BILL 269**

September 17, 2001 - Offered by Representative GUNDERSON.

1 **AN ACT to amend** 29.561 (1); and **to create** 29.561 (1m) of the statutes; **relating**
2 **to:** reserved deer hunting back tag numbers.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

3 **SECTION 1.** 29.561 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

4 29.561 (1) COLLECTION OF FEE. The department shall establish a system under
5 which the department shall reserve a deer hunting back tag number for a person who
6 ~~pays a reservation fee~~ applies for such a number. The department may limit the
7 number of back tag numbers that may be reserved under this system. Upon payment
8 of the an initial fee each year, the department shall issue ~~the same~~ a reserved back
9 tag number to that person. Except as provided in sub. (1m), the department shall
10 issue, without charging a fee, the same back tag number to that person in each
11 subsequent year in which the department issues the person a deer hunting back tag.
12 Any person, including the department, who reserves a back tag number ~~shall collect,~~

1 ~~in addition to each~~ and who collects a reservation fee, shall also collect an issuing fee
2 of 50 cents.

3 **SECTION 2.** 29.561 (1m) of the statutes is created to read:

4 29.561 **(1m)** CANCELLATION OF RESERVED NUMBER. If the department issues a
5 reserved back tag number under sub. (1) and the person to whom it is issued does not
6 use the reserved back tag number for a specified number of deer hunting seasons, as
7 determined by the department, the department may cancel the reserved back tag
8 number issued to that person. If the department cancels the reserved back tag
9 number, the department may issue a different reserved back tag number to that
10 person upon application and payment of the initial fee as provided under sub. (1).

11 **SECTION 3. Effective date.**

12 (1) This act takes effect retroactively to March 1, 2000.
