



**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 5,  
TO ASSEMBLY SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,  
TO 2005 ASSEMBLY BILL 100**

June 21, 2005 – Offered by Representatives KREUSER and RICHARDS.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the substitute amendment as follows:

2 **1.** Page 95, line 18: increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2005–06 by  
3 \$500,100 and increase the dollar amount for fiscal year 2006–07 by \$830,100 to  
4 increase funding for the purpose for which the appropriation is made.

5 **2.** Page 96, line 15: after that line insert:

6 “(dp) Four-year-old kindergarten

7 grants GPR A -0- 3,000,000”.

8 **3.** Page 257, line 22: after that line insert:

9 “**SECTION 181m.** 20.255 (2) (dp) of the statutes is created to read:

10 20.255 (2) (dp) *Four-year-old kindergarten grants.* The amounts in the  
11 schedule for 4-year-old kindergarten grants under s. 115.445.”.

12 **4.** Page 759, line 11: after that line insert:

1           “**SECTION 1857r.** 115.341 (1) of the statutes is amended to read:

2           115.341 (1) From the appropriation under s. 20.255 (2) (cm), the state  
3 superintendent shall reimburse each school board ~~10~~ 15 cents for each breakfast  
4 served at a school that meets the requirements of 7 CFR 220.8 or 220.8a, whichever  
5 is applicable, and shall reimburse each governing body of a private school ~~10~~ 15 cents  
6 for each breakfast served at the private school that meets the requirements of 7 CFR  
7 220.8 or 220.8a, whichever is applicable.”.

8           **5.** Page 761, line 8: after that line insert:

9           “**SECTION 1863m.** 115.445 of the statutes is created to read:

10           **115.445 Four-year-old kindergarten grants.** (1) A school board may  
11 apply to the department for up to 2 annual grants under this section to implement  
12 a 4-year-old kindergarten program.

13           (2) (a) For the initial grant awarded under this section, the department shall  
14 pay the school board up to \$3,000 for each 4-year-old kindergarten pupil enrolled  
15 in the school district. For the second grant awarded under this section, the  
16 department shall pay the school board up to \$1,500 for each 4-year-old kindergarten  
17 pupil enrolled in the school district.

18           (b) The department shall pay grants under this section from the appropriation  
19 under s. 20.255 (2) (dp) and shall give preference in awarding grants to school boards  
20 that use community approaches to early education, as defined by the department by  
21 rule. If the funds in this appropriation are insufficient to pay all eligible school  
22 boards, the department shall prorate the payments.

23           (3) The department shall promulgate rules to implement this section.”.

1           **6.** Page 765, line 10: delete the material beginning with that line and ending  
2 with page 766, line 2, and substitute:

3           “**SECTION 1884m.** 118.43 (2) (bw) of the statutes is created to read:

4           118.43 (2) (bw) In the 2006-07 school year, the school board of an eligible school  
5 district may enter into a 5-year achievement guarantee contract with the  
6 department on behalf of one or more schools in the school district if all of the following  
7 apply:

8           1. The school board is not receiving a grant under the preschool to grade 5  
9 program on behalf of any of the schools under s. 115.45.

10           2. The school board, if eligible to participate in the program under this section  
11 in the 1996-97 and 1998-99 school years, had participated in the program during  
12 either school year.

13           3. None of the schools is a beneficiary of a contract under this section.

14           **SECTION 1884r.** 118.43 (2) (e) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:

15           118.43 (2) (e) 1. If the school board of an eligible school district does not enter  
16 into an achievement guarantee contract with the department, a school board that  
17 has entered into such a contract, other than the school board of the school district  
18 operating under ch. 119, may apply to the department to enter into such a contract  
19 on behalf of one or more schools that meet the requirements under par. (b), (bg) ~~or~~,  
20 (br), or (bw).

21           **SECTION 1884s.** 118.43 (2) (g) of the statutes is amended to read:

22           118.43 (2) (g) The department may renew an achievement guarantee contract  
23 under pars. (b), (bg), ~~and (br)~~, and (bw) for one or more terms of 5 school years. As  
24 a condition of receiving payments under a renewal of an achievement guarantee

1 contract, a school board shall maintain the reduction of class size achieved during  
2 the last school year of the original achievement guarantee contract for the grades  
3 specified for the last school year of the contract.

4 **SECTION 1884t.** 118.43 (3) (intro.) of the statutes is amended to read:

5 118.43 (3) CONTRACT REQUIREMENTS. (intro.) Except as provided in pars. (am)  
6 and, (ar), and (aw), an achievement guarantee contract shall require the school board  
7 to do all of the following in each participating school:

8 **SECTION 1884u.** 118.43 (3) (aw) of the statutes is created to read:

9 118.43 (3) (aw) *Class size; additional contracts.* For contracts that begin in the  
10 2006–07 school year, reduce each class size to 15 in the following manner:

- 11 1. In the 2006–07 school year, in at least grades kindergarten and one.
- 12 2. In the 2007–08 school year, in at least grades kindergarten to 2.
- 13 3. In the 2008–09 to 2009–10 school years, in at least grades kindergarten to  
14 3.”.

15 **7.** Page 766, line 12: delete the material beginning with that line and ending  
16 with page 767, line 2, and substitute:

17 **“SECTION 1892m.** 118.43 (6) (b) 9. of the statutes is created to read:

18 118.43 (6) (b) 9. In the 2005–06 school year, \$2,250 multiplied by the number  
19 of low-income pupils enrolled in grades eligible for funding in each school in the  
20 school district covered by renewals of contracts under sub. (2) (g).

21 **SECTION 1892r.** 118.43 (6) (b) 10. of the statutes is created to read:

22 118.43 (6) (b) 10. In the 2006–07 school year, \$2,500 multiplied by the number  
23 of low-income pupils enrolled in grades eligible for funding in each school in the  
24 school district covered by renewals of contracts under sub. (2) (g). After making these

1 payments, the department shall pay school districts on behalf of schools that are  
2 covered by contracts under sub. (3) (aw) an amount equal to \$2,500 multiplied by the  
3 number of low-income pupils enrolled in grades eligible for funding in each school  
4 in the school district covered by contract under sub. (3) (aw). In making these  
5 payments, the department shall give priority to schools that have the highest  
6 percentage of low-income pupil enrollment and shall ensure that it fully distributes  
7 the amount appropriated.

8 **SECTION 1892s.** 118.43 (6) (c) of the statutes is amended to read:

9 118.43 (6) (c) The amount paid to a school district in any school year under par.  
10 (b) may not exceed an amount equal to ~~\$2,000~~ \$2,500 multiplied by the number of  
11 low-income pupils enrolled in grades eligible for funding in each school in the school  
12 district covered by contracts under this section.”.

13 **8.** Page 1034, line 23: after that line insert:

14 “(1k) SCHOOL BREAKFAST PROGRAMS. The treatment of section 115.341 (1) of the  
15 statutes first applies to breakfasts served during the 2004-05 school year.”.

16 **9.** Page 1048, line 18: after that line insert:

17 “(5r) FOUR-YEAR-OLD KINDERGARTEN GRANT PROGRAM. The creation of sections  
18 20.255 (2) (dp) and 115.445 of the statutes takes effect on July 1, 2006.”.
