**ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 20,
TO ASSEMBLY BILL 11**

February 22, 2011 – Offered by Representative RADCLIFFE.

1 At the locations indicated, amend the bill as follows:

2 **1.** Page 8, line 19: after that line insert:

3 “**SECTION 3r.** 13.123 (1) (a) 1. of the statutes is amended to read:

4 13.123 **(1)** (a) 1. Any member of the legislature who has signified, by affidavit

5 filed with the department of administration, the necessity of establishing a

6 temporary residence at the state capital for the period of any regular or special

7 legislative session shall be entitled to an allowance for expenses incurred for food and

8 lodging for each day that he or she is in Madison on legislative business, but not

9 including any Saturday or Sunday unless the legislator is in actual attendance on

10 such day at a session of the legislature or a meeting of a standing committee of which

11 the legislator is a member. The amount of the allowance for each biennial session

12 shall be 90% of the per diem rate for travel for federal government business within

13 the city of Madison, as established by the federal general services administration.

1 For the purpose of determining the amount of the allowance, the director of the office
2 of state employment relations shall certify to the chief clerk of each house the federal
3 per diem rate in effect on December 1, or the first business day thereafter if December
4 1 is not a business day, in each even-numbered year. Each legislator shall file an
5 affidavit with the chief clerk of his or her house certifying the specific dollar amount
6 within the authorized allowance the member wishes to receive. Such affidavit, when
7 filed, shall remain in effect for the biennial session. A legislator may not claim a per
8 diem allowance on more than 50 days in a year.”.
