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**SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1,
TO SENATE BILL 51**

November 4, 2013 – Offered by Senator OLSEN.

1 **AN ACT** *to renumber and amend* 118.33 (1) (a) 1.; and *to create* 118.33 (1) (a)
2 1. e. of the statutes; **relating to:** the number of mathematics and science credits
3 required for a high school diploma and high school credits for coursework in
4 computer sciences.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a school board may not grant a high school diploma to any student unless the student has earned all of the following minimum credits in the high school grades: four credits of English; three credits of social studies; two credits of mathematics; two credits of science; and one and one-half credits of physical education. This substitute amendment increases the required credits in mathematics and science to three, and permits a school board to count towards one credit of mathematics a course in computer sciences.
