## SENATE SUBSTITUTE AMENDMENT 1, TO SENATE BILL 228

1	AN ACT to amend $39.465(1)(a), 39.465(1)(d), 39.465(2), 39.465(3)(a), 39.465(3)(a), 39.465(3)(a), 39.465(3)(a), 39.465(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)(a)($
2	(3) (b) and 39.465 (4); and <i>to create</i> 39.465 (1) (b), 39.465 (1) (e) and 39.465 (5)
3	of the statutes; <b>relating to:</b> scholarships for Marquette University School of
4	Dentistry students who practice in dental health shortage areas.
	The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:
5	<b>SECTION 1.</b> 39.465 (1) (a) of the statutes, as created by 2019 Wisconsin Act 9,
6	is amended to read:
7	39.465 (1) (a) "Actual practice total" is the total number of months that a
8	student upon graduation practices <u>dentistry</u> in a <u>dental</u> health shortage area in this
9	state. For purposes of this paragraph, a fraction of a month is counted as one month.
10	<b>SECTION 2.</b> 39.465 (1) (b) of the statutes is created to read:

1	39.465 (1) (b) "Dental health shortage area" has the meaning given in s. 36.60
2	(1) (ad), except that "dental health shortage area" does not include an area in the
3	county of Brown, Dane, Kenosha, Milwaukee, or Waukesha.
4	<b>SECTION 3.</b> 39.465 (1) (d) of the statutes, as created by 2019 Wisconsin Act 9,
5	is amended to read:
6	39.465 (1) (d) "Required practice total" means the total number of months a
7	student upon graduation is required under sub. (3) to practice <u>dentistry</u> in a <u>dental</u>
8	health shortage area in this state.
9	<b>SECTION 4.</b> 39.465 (1) (e) of the statutes is created to read:
10	39.465 (1) (e) "School" means the Marquette University School of Dentistry.
11	<b>SECTION 5.</b> 39.465 $(2)$ of the statutes, as created by 2019 Wisconsin Act 9, is
12	amended to read:
13	39.465 (2) SCHOLARSHIPS. In consultation with the department of health
14	services, the board shall establish a program for awarding <u>to no more than 5</u>
15	first-year students at the school an annual scholarship, including a stipend, equal
16	to \$40,000 for each year of a student's enrollment but not exceeding 4 years. The
17	board shall pay the scholarships from the appropriation account under s. $20.235~(1)$
18	(dg).
19	<b>SECTION 6.</b> 39.465 (3) (a) of the statutes, as created by 2019 Wisconsin Act 9,
20	is amended to read:
21	39.465 (3) (a) A student is not eligible for a scholarship under the program
22	established under sub. (2) unless he or she is a resident of the state and enters into
23	an agreement with <u>the</u> board in which he or she agrees upon graduation to practice
24	<u>dentistry</u> in a <u>dental</u> health shortage area in this state for a period equal to $18 \ 12$

months multiplied by the number of annual scholarships the board awards to thestudent under the program.

3 SECTION 7. 39.465 (3) (b) of the statutes, as created by 2019 Wisconsin Act 9,
4 is amended to read:

5 39.465 (3) (b) An agreement under par. (a) shall specify that if a student fails 6 to practice <u>dentistry</u> in a <u>dental</u> health shortage area in this state for the period 7 required under par. (a), he or she is liable to the state for an amount equal to the total 8 dollar amount of annual scholarships awarded to the student multiplied by the 9 student's repayment liability percentage.

SECTION 8. 39.465 (4) of the statutes, as created by 2019 Wisconsin Act 9, is
amended to read:

12 39.465 (4) GEOGRAPHIC DIVERSITY. The In cooperation with the school, the board 13 shall make every effort to ensure that students who are awarded scholarships under 14 the program established under sub. (2) practice <u>dentistry</u> upon graduation in 15 geographically diverse <u>dental</u> health shortage areas in this state.

16 **SECTION 9.** 39.465 (5) of the statutes is created to read:

39.465 (5) RECRUITMENT AND TRAINING. From the appropriation account under
s. 20.235 (1) (dg), the board shall provide the school \$350,000 annually for the
development and operation of programs to support the recruitment and training of
students in rural dentistry.
