  - **2.** Page 2, line 9: after "may" insert "use his or her public position or office or the property or resources of this state to".
    - **3.** Page 2, line 13: after "may" insert "use his or her public position or office or the property or resources of the federal government to".
      - **4.** Page 2, line 14: after that line insert:
    - "(c) Notwithstanding pars. (a) and (b), a state public official holding an elective office or a U.S. senator or representative in congress elected to his or her office in this state may report harassment, an apparent violation of law, content that is obscene or pornographic in nature, or expressive material not protected by the First Amendment of the U.S. Constitution to a social media Internet site.".
