## **ENROLLED JOINT RESOLUTION**

**Relating to:** congratulating First Lady Tonette Walker and the Fostering Futures Steering Committee.

Whereas, Fostering Futures strives to provide focus on improving the lives of children, especially those in foster care, by sharing the concept of trauma–informed care; and

Whereas, educating government officials on the science of early-brain development and the impact of Adverse Childhood Experiences has been a priority of Fostering Futures; and
