

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 66

PROVIDING FOR THE PROTECTION OF LIFE AND PROPERTY

IN THE CITY OF MILWAUKEE

WHEREAS; the Mayor of the City of Milwaukee has requested me to use such of the National Guard of Wisconsin as may be necessary to protect life and property;

NOW, THEREFORE, by virtue of the authority vested in me and of the National Guard by the Constitution and the laws of the State of Wisconsin including Chapter 21 of the State Statutes, I hereby order the following effective from 3:40 a.m. November 5, 1973 until such time as the threat to lives and property ceases to exist or until my further order;

Section 1. The Adjutant General is authorized and directed to take all appropriate steps to assist civil authorities in the City of Milwaukee to protect life and property.

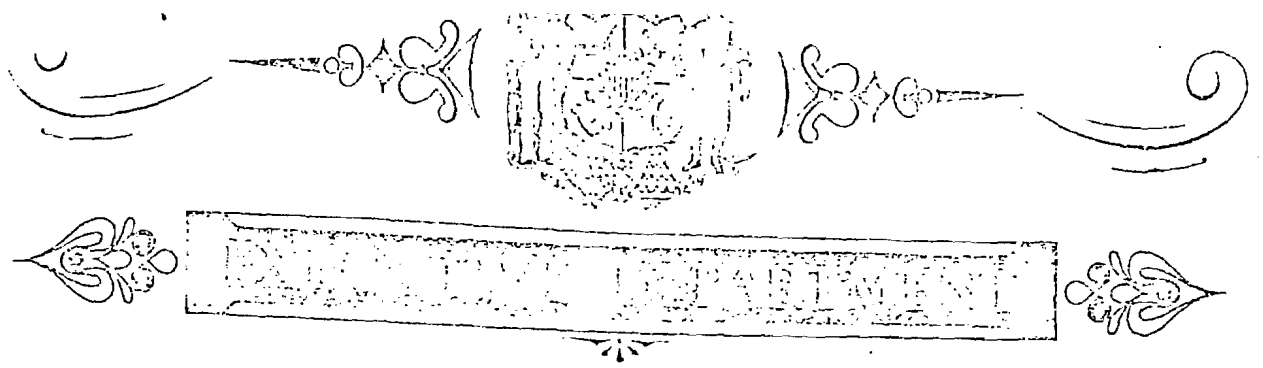
Section 2. In carrying out the provisions of Section 1, The Adjutant General is authorized to use such of Wisconsin National Guard as he may deem necessary.

Section 3:- The Adjutant General is hereby authorized and directed to call into state military service, as he may deem appropriate to carry out the purposes of this order, any or all of the personnel and units of the Army National Guard and of the Air National Guard of the State of Wisconsin to serve for an indefinite period and until relieved by appropriate orders. Units, or members thereof, may be relieved subject to recall at the discretion of The Adjutant General. In carrying out the provisions of Section 1, The Adjutant General is authorized to use units and members thereof, called into the state military service pursuant to this section.

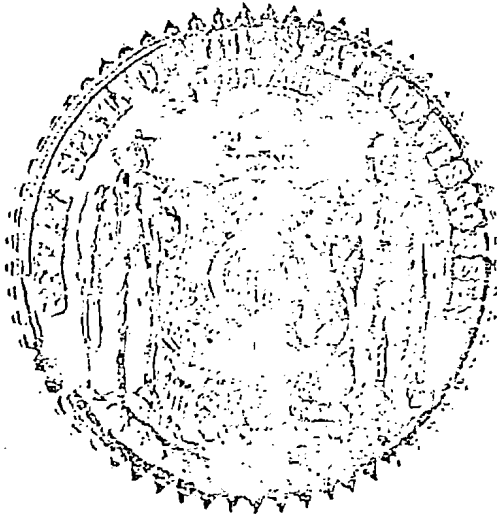

Section 4. All officers and enlisted men of the Wisconsin National Guard ordered to State Active Duty by competent authority under Section 3 of this Executive Order, are granted the powers and authority of a peace officer in carrying out the provisions of Section 1.
