



## EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 56

WHEREAS, a vacancy will exist in the office of the State Representative from the 84th Assembly District, as a result of the resignation of Harry G. Snyder, whose term of office would have commenced on the first Monday in January, 1981 and would have expired on the first Monday in January, 1983;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, LEE SHERMAN DREYFUS, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by virtue of the authority vested in me by Section 8.50, Wisconsin Statutes, do hereby order that a Special Election, to fill the vacancy, be held on April 7, 1981, in the 84th Assembly District, consisting of parts of Jefferson and Waukesha counties, as described in Section 4.28(3), Wisconsin Statutes.

AND, the circulation of nominating papers for partisan and independent candidates may commence on December 9, 1980; the deadline for filing nomination papers for partisan and independent candidates shall be 5:00 P.M., January 6, 1981. The special primary shall be held on February 17, 1981. The election shall be noticed, held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with the law.
