

EXECUTIVE ORDER NO. 17

WHEREAS, a vacancy exists in the office of State Senator from the 24th Senate District, due to the resignation, effective August 1, 1983, of Senator William Bablitch, whose term of office would have expired on the first Monday in January of 1985.

NOW, THEREFORE, I, ANTHONY S. EARL, Governor of the State of Wisconsin, by the authority given me by Wisconsin Statutes s. 8.50, do order that a special election to fill the vacancy be held on August 2, 1983 in the 24th Senate District, as described in the judicial reapportionment plan ordered in Wisconsin AFL-CIO, et. al. v. Elections Board, et. al. 543 F. Supp. 630, (E.D. Wis. 1982), which district consists of the 58th, 59th and 60th Assembly Districts, including portions of the counties of Portage, Waupaca, Wood and Marathon.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED, that the circulation of nomination papers for candidates may commence on the date of this order and said nomination papers may be filed no later than 5:00 p.m., June 7, 1983, and the primary, if one is necessary, shall be held on July 5, 1983. The election shall be held, conducted, canvassed and returned in accordance with the law.
