A person who operates a fish farm must register the fish farm annually with the Department of Agriculture, Trade and Consumer Protection (DATCP). [See s. 95.60, Stats.]

2003 Wisconsin Act 136 repeals the requirement in the former statute for a fish farm operator to obtain an annual health certificate from a veterinarian or from a person who has the qualifications specified by DATCP for issuing a fish health certificate. The fish health certificate under the former statute applied to fish eggs present on the fish farm or fish reared on the fish farm, with certain exceptions. In lieu of the requirement for an annual fish health certificate, Act 136 authorizes DATCP to promulgate rules that require any evidence of fish health that DATCP deems necessary.

Act 136 also deletes a requirement from the former statute for DATCP to consult with the Department of Natural Resources when it promulgates rules specifying the qualifications a person who is not a veterinarian must have in order to provide evidence of fish health.
