2003 Wisconsin Act 189 creates an increased penalty for burglary in a dwelling, boat, or motor home if another person is lawfully present in the dwelling, boat, or motor home at the time of the burglary.

Generally, a person who commits a burglary is guilty of a Class F felony, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$25,000 and a term of imprisonment and extended supervision not to exceed 12 years and six months.

Under Act 189, a person who commits a burglary by intentionally entering a dwelling, boat, or motor home with the intent to steal or commit a felony when another person is lawfully present in the dwelling, boat, or motor home is guilty of a Class E felony, punishable by a fine not to exceed \$50,000 and a term of imprisonment and extended supervision not to exceed 15 years.

Effective Date: Act 189 takes effect on April 22, 2004.
