## 2003 Wisconsin Act 49 [2003 Senate Bill 4]

## Possession of Methamphetamine

2003 Wisconsin Act 49 amends the law relating to the possession of methamphetamine.

Under prior law, s. 961.41 (3g) (d), Stats., provided that a first conviction for the possession of methamphetamine would result in a fine of not more than \$5,000 or imprisonment for not more than one year or both (a misdemeanor) and a second or subsequent conviction for the possession of methamphetamine would result in a Class I felony. A Class I felony is punishable by a fine not to exceed \$10,000 or imprisonment, including extended supervision, not to exceed three years and six months or both.

Wisconsin Act 49 creates s. 961.41 (3g) (g), Stats., to provide that a person who possesses or attempts to possess methamphetamine is guilty of a Class I felony. In other words, under the Act, the first offense will no longer be treated as a misdemeanor.

Effective Date: The Act takes effect on September 3, 2003.
