

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

2005 Wisconsin Act 244 [2005 Assembly Bill 971]

Distribution of Report on Criminal Defendant's Examination by a Physician or Psychologist

Current law provides that if the mental responsibility of a defendant is relevant in a criminal action, the court may appoint a physician or psychologist to examine the defendant and testify at trial. The defense or prosecution may also arrange for a physician or psychologist to examine the defendant.

2005 Wisconsin Act 244 provides that a physician or psychologist selected by the defense or prosecution may not testify at trial unless the examiner's report is provided to opposing counsel at least 15 days before trial. Under *prior law*, the report was required to be provided to opposing counsel at least three days before trial.

Effective Date: Act 244 took effect on April 13, 2006.
