## 2005 Wisconsin Act 279 [2005 Assembly Bill 727]

## Notice of Alibi Claims in Criminal Cases

Act 279 addresses notice of alibi claims in criminal cases in order to provide more time to investigate such claims. The Act:

- Requires the defendant to give notice of an alibi at least 30 days before trial (increased from the prior law's 15 days before trial).
- Requires the district attorney to provide notice of any alibi rebuttal witnesses within 20 days after receiving the defendant's notice of alibi (increased from the prior law's 10 days after receiving the notice).

The court's authority to extend the deadline for an alibi notice and to revise the time for notice of rebuttal witnesses is unaffected.

Effective Date: Act 279 became effective April 20, 2006.
