2005 Wisconsin Act 84 [2005 Senate Bill 180]

Cash Discounts for Purchases

2005 Wisconsin Act 84 creates a new law relating to cash discounts for purchases.

Current federal law generally provides that, in a consumer credit transaction, a credit card issuer may not prohibit a merchant from offering a discount to a consumer in order to induce the consumer to pay by cash rather than pay by use of a credit card.

Wisconsin Act 84 makes state law equivalent to federal law. Thus, a credit card issuer may not, under Wisconsin law, prohibit a merchant from offering a discount to a customer to induce the customer to pay by cash rather than pay by use of a credit card. This provision only applies in a consumer credit transaction when the amount financed is \$25,000 or less and when credit is sought for personal, family, or household purposes. A contract clause contrary to this policy will be unenforceable in Wisconsin.

Effective Date: The Act takes effect on January 10, 2006.
