2009 Wisconsin Act 94 [2009 Senate Bill 288]

Indian Child Welfare Act

2009 Wisconsin Act 94 incorporates the Federal Indian Child Welfare Act (ICWA) into the Children's Code [ch. 48, Stats.] and the Juvenile Justice Code [ch. 938, Stats.]. ICWA was enacted in 1978.

In very general terms, ICWA: applies to certain child custody proceedings involving an Indian child; requires certain notices, findings, and placement preferences in child custody proceedings under certain circumstances; and provides grounds for collateral attack of certain decrees. ICWA provides for tribal court jurisdiction in some circumstances and also provides a process for a tribe to reassume exclusive jurisdiction in child custody proceedings under certain circumstances. In addition, ICWA provides that a foster care placement or termination of parental rights case may be transferred from state court to tribal court under certain circumstances and that a tribe may intervene in certain child custody proceedings in state court under certain circumstances.

Effective date: Act 94 took effect on December 22, 2009.
