

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

## 2013 Wisconsin Act 197 [2013 Assembly Bill 668]

## Substance Abuse Treatment and Diversion From Incarceration

2013 Wisconsin Act 197 (hereinafter, "the Act") creates additional data collection and reporting requirements for the Treatment Alternatives and Diversion (TAD) program at the Department of Justice (DOJ) and provides an additional \$1,500,000 in grant funding to the TAD program during the 2013-15 fiscal biennium. Specifically, the Act does the following:

- Requires any county receiving a TAD grant to submit data that is requested by DOJ to DOJ
  each month. The Act authorizes DOJ to request any data regarding a county's TAD
  program funded by the grant that is necessary to evaluate it and prepare reports required
  under the Act.
- Requires DOJ to annually analyze the data submitted by counties receiving TAD grants and prepare a progress report that evaluates the effectiveness of the TAD grant program. DOJ shall make this report available to the public.
- Requires DOJ to prepare a comprehensive report every five years that analyzes the data it
  receives from a county receiving a TAD grant and the annual reports it produces as
  described above. DOJ must also include a cost benefit analysis of the TAD grant program in
  the comprehensive report and must submit the report to the chief clerk of each house of the
  legislature for distribution to the Legislature.
- Provides an additional \$1,500,000 annually in the TAD appropriation during the 2013-15 fiscal biennium, to provide grants for counties that establish alternatives to prosecution an incarceration for criminal offenders. In doing so, it increases the base funding for the TAD program by \$1,500,000 annually.

*Effective date:* This Act went into effect on April 9, 2014.
