

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

## 2013 Wisconsin Act 217 2013 Senate Bill 574

**Oversize Loads of Propane** 

Under current law, a person must obtain a permit from the Department of Transportation (DOT) or a local authority to operate on any highway a vehicle or combination of vehicles that exceeds certain statutory weight limits. Also under current law, DOT or a local highway authority may impose special weight limits on highways that, due to special or temporary conditions, would likely be seriously damaged or destroyed in the absence of the special limits. In such instances, an overweight permit must expressly authorize the special weight limits to be exceeded.

2013 Wisconsin Act 217 authorizes the DOT to issue permits allowing vehicles transporting loads of propane or heating oil for delivery to residences to exceed the special weight limitations during an energy emergency declared by the Governor.

An energy emergency permit authorizes the operation of vehicles up to 26,000 pounds. The operator is required, to the extent practicable, to deliver propane or heating oil at times of the day when the highways used are the least vulnerable.
