

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

2013 Wisconsin Act 249 [2013 Senate Bill 452]

Underage Persons on Premises Operating Under a Retail Alcohol Beverage License

Subject to various exceptions, under Wisconsin law, a person who has not reached legal drinking age (21 years of age), and who is not accompanied by his or her parent, guardian, or spouse who has attained legal drinking age, may not enter or be on any premises for which a license or permit for the retail sale of alcohol beverages has been issued. **2013 Wisconsin Act 249** creates an exception to this prohibition. The Act allows an unaccompanied person who has not reached legal drinking age to enter and remain in a banquet or hospitality room on winery premises licensed for the retail sale of alcohol beverages for the purpose of attending a winery tour.

Effective date: The Act took effect on April 10, 2014.
