2013 Wisconsin Act 305 [2013 Senate Bill 512]

Deposits on Sale of Lead Acid Batteries

May 15, 2014

2013 Wisconsin Act 305 requires a person who sells a consumer a replacement lead acid motor vehicle battery to charge a deposit of \$10.

Wisconsin statutes require anyone who sells and installs a lead acid motor vehicle battery to a consumer to accept and properly dispose of the consumer's used battery. Wisconsin statutes also require a person who sells a lead acid battery uninstalled to offer to take the used battery in trade.

Prior law permitted a lead acid battery seller to charge a consumer a deposit of not more than \$5 on the sale of a lead acid battery. 2013 Wisconsin Act 305 requires a lead acid battery seller to charge a \$10 deposit on the sale of such a battery.

Effective date: This Act took effect April 18, 2014.
