2015 Wisconsin Act 137 [2015 Assembly Bill 426]

Radiological Material Transport Permits

2015 WISCONSIN ACT 137

The Act allows the Department of Transportation (DOT) to issue a single-trip permit for the transport of radiological materials. The permit must include a designated route to be used by the applicant and a requirement for a state traffic patrol escort.

The Act requires that DOT must notify local officials if an applicant's proposed route includes a highway under the jurisdiction of a local authority.

The Act also provides for a \$1,800 fee for the permit, with funds received from the fee deposited into the general fund and credited to the transportation appropriation fund for escort, security, and traffic enforcement. A person who violates the radiological material transport permit may be required to forfeit no less than \$2,000 or more than \$5,000.

Additionally, an applicant for a permit must provide proof that each person operating a vehicle under the permit has a commercial driver's license, the applicant has sufficient liability insurance, and the applicant has a valid motor carrier certificate.
