

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL ACT MEMO

## 2015 Wisconsin Act 163 [2015 Assembly Bill 778]

## Charitable Organizations, the Solicitation of Funds for Charitable Purposes, and Professional Employer Organizations

2015 Wisconsin Act 163 makes a variety of changes to the regulation of charitable organizations, individuals who solicit on behalf of charitable organizations, and professional employer organizations<sup>1</sup>. The initial legislation resulting in the Act was requested by the Department of Financial Institutions (DFI) as an update to current statutes.

In summary, the Act does the following:

- Modifies registration and reporting requirements for charitable organizations, professional fundraisers, fundraising counsel, and professional employer organizations.
- Modifies certain content, disclosure, and recording requirements for transactions between charitable organizations and professional fundraisers.
- Prohibits the use of certain acts of misrepresentation in the solicitation of funds.
- Permits DFI to make changes to filing thresholds using a passive review process with the Joint Committee for Review of Administrative Rules.

The provisions of the Act have a delayed effective date of June 1, 2016.
