## 2015 Wisconsin Act 262 [2015 Assembly Bill 367]

## Methadone Treatment Program Reports

2015 Wisconsin Act 262 (the Act) requires every treatment program that treats addiction using methadone to report the following information to the Department of Health Services (DHS) every year:

- The ratio of program staff to individuals receiving treatment.
- The number of individuals receiving treatment who are receiving behavioral health services.
- The relapse rate or the average time of treatment.
- The program's plan for tapering individuals off of methadone.
- The average mileage that individuals receiving treatment travel for treatment.
- The number of doses of methadone that individuals carry out of the facility.
- The number of individuals in the program on each of the three forms of medicationassisted treatment that are approved by the federal food and drug administration.
- The number of individuals who engage in a program of aftercare and the number of individuals who are treated with medication as part of relapse prevention.
- Any other information specified by DHS.

A treatment program must ensure that the information is provided in a manner that does not permit the identification of an individual who is receiving treatment.
