2017 Wisconsin Act 25 [January 2017 Special Session Assembly Bill 4]

Schedule V Controlled Substances

2017 Wisconsin Act 25 modifies requirements for dispensing certain substances included in schedule V of the state Uniform Controlled Substances Act. Prior law authorized dispensing of all schedule V controlled substances without a prescription, subject to various requirements and limitations. The Act creates a prescription requirement applicable to certain schedule V controlled substances.

The Act generally prohibits the dispensing of a schedule V controlled substance that is categorized as a "narcotic drug containing nonnarcotic active medicinal ingredients" without a prescription. The schedule V controlled substances currently included in this category are those containing codine, dihydrocodine, ethylmorphine, diphenoxylate, opium, or difenoxin in the amounts and in certain compounds, as applicable, that are specified in the statutes. However, the prescription requirement created under the Act does not apply to a substance dispensed directly by a practitioner, other than a pharmacy, to an ultimate user.
