## 2001 Assembly Bill 425

## **Assembly Amendment 1**

2001 Assembly Bill 425 prohibits a person from manufacturing, advertising, selling, delivering, or possessing with intent to advertise, sell, or deliver any product (a masking agent) with the intent that it be used to produce a false negative drug test result. The bill also prohibits a person from using or possessing with intent to use a masking agent with the intent to produce a false negative drug test result.

Assembly Amendment 1 creates a specific definition of "masking agent," rather than referring in the text of the prohibition to a product used to produce a false negative drug test result. Additionally, the definition of "masking agent" narrows the scope of the bill by limiting its application to masking agent products for which the "primary use" is to produce a false negative drug test result.

Passage of Assembly Bill 425, as amended by Assembly Amendment 1, was recommended by the Assembly Committee on Criminal Justice on a vote of Ayes, 10, Noes, 1.
