2001 Senate Bill 339 requires that, if a school board enters into a contract that grants one vendor the exclusive right to sell soft drinks in one or more schools in the school district, the school board shall ensure that milk is available to pupils in each school covered by the contract whenever and wherever soft drinks are available to pupils.

Senate Amendment 1 makes the following two changes to Senate Bill 339:

1. It specifies that an exclusive contract for the sale of soft drinks in a school may not prohibit the sale of milk in any school.

2. It modifies the requirement that the school district make milk available whenever and wherever soft drinks are available by stating that the school district must do so *to the maximum extent possible*.

On January 23, 2002, the Senate Committee on Labor and Agriculture introduced and recommended adoption of Senate Amendment 1 by a vote of Ayes, 5; and Noes, 0; it recommended passage of the bill, as amended, by the same vote.
