

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

Current law generally prohibits any vehicle from being equipped with a flashing light. An exception to this prohibition permits **the lead vehicle** or a motorcycle escort in a funeral procession **to be equipped with a flashing amber light**, but the light may be used only when the vehicle is used as a lead vehicle or escort in the funeral procession.

The **bill** allows **any vehicle** being operated in or as an escort to a funeral procession to be equipped with a flashing amber light, but the light may be used only in the funeral procession.

Senate Amendment 1 changes the bill to specify that the lead vehicle (as under current law) in a funeral procession may be equipped, or any vehicle in the procession may be equipped if all vehicles in the procession are so equipped, with a flashing amber light that may be used only in the procession.

## Legislative History

On March 4, 2004, the Senate Committee on Transportation and Information Infrastructure recommended passage of Senate Bill 398 (as amended by Senate amendment 1, which was adopted on a vote of Ayes, 4; Noes, 1) on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
