Senate Joint Resolution 7 is the second consideration of a proposed constitutional amendment providing that the people have the right to fish, hunt, trap, and take game subject only to reasonable restrictions as prescribed by law. The first consideration of this constitutional amendment, which became 2001 Enrolled Joint Resolution 16, also provided that the proposal be submitted to a vote of the people at the general election to be held on November 2, 2004.

Senate Amendment 1 to Senate Joint Resolution 7 provides that the proposal will be submitted to a vote of the people at the general election to be held on April 1, 2003.

Senate Amendment 1 was adopted by the Senate Committee on Judiciary, Corrections, and Privacy on January 16, 2003, on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0. On the same date, and by the same vote, the Senate Committee recommended adoption of Senate Joint Resolution 7, as amended.
