2005 Assembly Bill 178

Senate Amendment 1

Assembly Bill 178 authorizes the deferral of the use of certain hunting, trapping, and spearing approvals that involve the use of a random or preference selection system by members of the U.S. Armed Forces. To be eligible to request a deferral, the member must be serving on active duty and unable to exercise his or her privilege to fish, hunt, or trap as permitted by the approval due to his or her service on active duty in the U.S. Armed Forces.

Senate Amendment 1 also applies the deferral in the bill to members of the National Guard who are serving on active duty and unable to exercise their privileges to fish, hunt, or trap under these approvals due to their service on active duty in the National Guard.

Legislative History

Senate Amendment 1 was offered and recommended for adoption by the Senate Committee on Natural Resources and Transportation on October 20, 2005 by a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0. The committee recommended concurrence in Assembly Bill 178, as amended, on October 20, 2005 on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
