2005 Assembly Bill 266

Assembly Amendment 1

Assembly Bill 266 authorizes a town board to adopt a resolution, subject to ratification in a referendum that the town board must call, declaring its intent to become a charter town. A town is eligible to become a charter town if it meets the eligibility criteria provided in the bill. The bill specifies powers that may be exercised by a charter town, including the authority to create a tax incremental financing (TIF) district to the same extent as a city or village.

Assembly Amendment 1 specifies that if a charter town that has created a TIF district revokes its charter town status under the procedure provided in the bill, the charter town must continue to administer the TIF district until the district terminates.

LEGISLATIVE HISTORY

Assembly Amendment 1 was offered by the Assembly Committee on Rural Affairs and Renewable Energy. The committee recommended adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 on a vote of Ayes, 8; Noes, 0, and recommended passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 7; Noes, 1.
