

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

2005 Assembly Bill 299

Assembly Amendment 1

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Current law requires a county to enact a shoreland zoning ordinance that applies in its unincorporated area. Current law also provides that if a city or village annexes an area subject to shoreland zoning, the county shoreland zoning ordinance continues in effect and must be enforced by the annexing city or village.

Assembly Bill 299 eliminates the requirement that the county shoreland zoning ordinance continues in effect and must be enforced by the annexing city or village.

Assembly Amendment 1 corrects an error in the relating clause of the bill. The relating clause in the bill refers to annexation by cities, villages, or towns. Annexation is only done by cities or villages, and Assembly Amendment 1 deletes the reference to annexation by towns.

Legislative History

Assembly Amendment 1 was offered by the Assembly Committee on Natural Resources on May 25, 2005. The Assembly Committee on Natural Resources, on June 1, 2005, recommended adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 by a vote of Ayes, 13; Noes, 0, and recommended passage of the bill, as amended, by a vote of Ayes, 13; Noes, 0.

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
