Assembly Amendment 1 addresses that portion of Assembly Bill 51 which provides that if a court takes possession of a person's license because the person has been convicted of an offense for which revocation of the person's operating privilege is mandatory or if a court otherwise suspends or revokes a person's operating privilege, the court must destroy the license. Assembly Amendment 1 specifies that if a court takes a person's license under these circumstances, the court must destroy the license by shredding it.

Legislative History

Assembly Amendment 1 was offered by Representative Ainsworth. The Assembly Committee on Corrections and the Courts recommended adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 on a vote of Ayes, 9; Noes, 0, and recommended passage of the bill, as amended, by the same vote.

The Assembly adopted Assembly Amendment 1 on a voice vote and passed the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 83; Noes, 9.
