

WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

2005 Senate Bill 194	Senate Amendments 1, 2, and 3

Senate Bill 194 pertains to involvement of military base commanders with local zoning entities and creates a council on military and state relations. The bill also requires a seller of real estate located within a two-mile radius of a military installation, at which training activities are conducted, to include this fact as a defect in the real estate disclosure report.

Senate Amendment 1 deletes the real estate disclosure provisions of the bill.

Senate Amendment 2 is a technical amendment that inserts two words that were missing from the bill.

Senate Amendment 3 provides that the chairperson of the council on military and state relations, created in the bill, is to be elected by the members of the council.

Legislative History

On May 4, 2005, the Senate Committee on Veterans, Homeland Security, Military Affairs, Small Business and Government Reform introduced, and recommended for adoption, Senate Amendments 1, 2, and 3, both on votes of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0. The committee then recommended passage of Senate Bill 194, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
