

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

2005 Senate Bill 533

Senate Substitute Amendment 1

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2005 Senate Bill 533 authorizes cities, villages, and towns to, by ordinance, do all of the following:

- Allow the use of neighborhood electric vehicles on roadways over which they have jurisdiction.
- License neighborhood electric vehicles used within the city, village, or town.

The bill defines "neighborhood electric vehicle" as a self-propelled motor vehicle that meets the definition and safety standards for low-speed vehicles under federal law and that has completed a specified test program of the federal Department of Energy.

Senate Substitute Amendment 1 differs from the bill in the following ways:

- Operation of neighborhood electric vehicles is limited to roadways that have a speed limit of 35 miles per hour or less.
- The city, village, or town must enter into an agreement with, or obtain the consent of, each governing body that shares jurisdiction over a roadway within the city, village, or town to permit the vehicles to use or cross the roadway.

## Legislative History

The Senate Committee on Energy, Utilities, and Information Technology recommended adoption of Senate Amendment 1 and passage of Senate Bill 533, as amended, on votes of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.

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
