CURRENT LAW

Under current law, each boat must have on it a personal flotation device for each person riding in or on the boat.

2009 SENATE BILL 162, AS AMENDED AND PASSED BY THE SENATE

Under 2009 Senate Bill 162, as amended and passed by the Senate ("the bill"), a person may not operate a recreational boat that is less than 26 feet in length unless, during the time the boat is under way, every person on the boat **who is 10 years old or younger** is **wearing** a personal flotation device (PFD) or is in a cabin space or below the deck.

The bill provides a specific penalty for a violation of this PFD requirement by the operator of the specified recreational boat. Any person violating this mandatory PFD provision must be issued a warning notice instead of a violation for the first offense. Any person subsequently violating the mandatory PFD provision must forfeit not more than \$50 for the second offense and must forfeit not more \$100 upon conviction of a third or subsequent offense.

The bill, if enacted into law, would take effect on May 1, 2010, or on the day after enactment, whichever is later.

Legislative History

On October 20, 2009, the Senate passed the bill, as amended by Senate Amendments 1 and 2. Adoption of the amendments and passage of the bill were all on voice votes.
