2009 Senate Bill 244 amends the current law relating to Specific Information Signs (SIS) on certain portions of State Trunk Highway (STH) 21.

Senate Amendment 2 revises the portion of STH 21 that is set forth in the bill. With the revised language in Senate Amendment 2, the bill eliminates the authorization for SIS from that portion of STH 21 from I 94 north or Tomah to <u>CTH-Z in the town of Strongs Prairie in Adams County and from STH 13 north of the village of Friendship in Adams County</u> (underlined portion added by Senate Amendment 2, replacing language in the bill).

Under the bill, as amended, because SIS requirements would no longer apply to this specified portion of STH 21, the Tourist Directional Sign (TODS) program guidelines under the statutes and rules would govern this portion.

Legislative History

At an Executive Session on September 30, 2009, the Senate Committee on Transportation, Tourism, Forestry, and Natural Resources adopted Senate Amendment 2 (offered by Senator Lassa) and recommended passage of the bill, as so amended, both on votes of Ayes, 7; Noes, 0.
