

## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

## Background

Under current law, the Department of Justice (DOJ) may not issue a license to carry a concealed weapon if the applicant is not a Wisconsin resident. 2013 Assembly Bill 740 (hereinafter, "the bill") allows DOJ to issue a license to an applicant if he or she is in active service in the U.S. armed forces and is **stationed in Wisconsin for at least one year**, regardless of whether or not the applicant is a Wisconsin resident.

## Assembly Amendment 1

Assembly Amendment 1 amends the bill to allow DOJ to issue a license to carry a concealed weapon to an applicant who is in active service in the U.S. armed forces and is **stationed in Wisconsin for a term that is scheduled to be for at least one year in duration**. This amendment clarifies that the applicant does not have to serve the one-year term before DOJ may issue the license.

## **Bill History**

On February 19, 2014, Representative Vruwink introduced Assembly Amendment 1. On February 20, 2014, the Assembly Committee on Criminal Justice voted to recommend adoption of Assembly Amendment 1 by a vote of Ayes, 10; Noes, 0; and Absent, 1; and voted to recommend passage of the bill, as amended, by a vote of Ayes, 9; Noes, 1; and Absent, 1.
