



## WISCONSIN LEGISLATIVE COUNCIL AMENDMENT MEMO

<b>2013 Senate Bill 647</b>	<b>Senate Amendment 1</b>

Under current law, no person may park, stop, or leave standing any vehicle upon any portion of a street, highway, or parking facility reserved for vehicles displaying special registration plates or a special identification card designating the vehicle as a vehicle used by a physically disabled person. Current law also prohibits a person from obstructing, blocking, or otherwise limiting the use of any space or access aisle reserved for the use physically disabled persons.

Under **2013 Senate Bill 647**, a disabled parking space violation may be enforced by a person who is employed by a city, village, or town and is designated by that city, village, or town to enforce disabled parking space violations. Under **Senate Amendment 1** to Senate Bill 647, a disabled parking space violation may be enforced by a person who is employed by a county and is designated by that county to enforce disabled parking space violations.

### **Bill History**

Senate Amendment 1 was offered by Senator Petrowski. On March 13, 2014, the Senate Committee on Transportation, Public Safety, and Veterans and Military Affairs voted to recommend adoption of Senate Amendment 1 and passage of the bill, as amended, on a vote of Ayes, 5; Noes, 0.
