2017 ASSEMBLY BILL 455

2017 Assembly Bill 455 eliminates the requirement that a person who hunts under the hunting mentorship program be at least 10 years old and eliminates the restriction prohibiting a mentee and a mentor from possessing more than one weapon between them while hunting. The bill also prohibits a mentor from killing a deer for a mentee while group hunting.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 3

2017 Wisconsin Act 59 eliminated all requirements relating to deer carcass tags. Assembly Amendment 3 reconciles that change with the provision in the bill prohibiting a mentor from killing a deer for a mentee.

BILL HISTORY

On November 2, 2017, Assembly Amendment 3 was introduced by Representatives Kleefisch and Stafsholt and adopted by the Assembly by a voice vote. The amended bill was passed by the Assembly on the same day by a vote of Ayes, 57; Noes, 32; Paired, 4.
