2019 Assembly Bill 530

Assembly Amendment 1

2019 ASSEMBLY BILL 530

2019 Assembly Bill 530 biennially appropriates \$500,000 for distribution by the Department of Health Services (DHS) to organizations or coalitions, which may include a city, village, town, or county, for suicide prevention programming. DHS may award a grant of up to \$10,000 in a single fiscal year to an eligible organization or coalition that contributes at least 20 percent of the grant amount in matching funds or in-kind services.

ASSEMBLY AMENDMENT 1

Assembly Amendment 1 makes the following changes to the bill:

- Provides that a federally recognized American Indian tribe or band located in the state is eligible to receive a grant created by the bill.
- Increases the maximum amount that DHS may award a grant to a recipient in a single fiscal year. The bill caps this amount at \$10,000 in a single fiscal year; the amendment increases this cap to \$25,000 in a single fiscal year.

BILL HISTORY

Representative James introduced Assembly Amendment 1 on October 25, 2019. On October 29, 2019, the Assembly Committee on Local Government voted to recommend both adoption of the amendment and passage of the bill, as amended, on subsequent votes of Ayes, 9; Noes, 0.
