March 7, 1996 – Introduced by Representatives Reynolds, Musser, Turner, Baumgart, R. Young, Wilder, Plombon, Olsen, Robson, Seratti and Gronemus, cosponsored by Senators Grobschmidt, Decker, Breske, Moen and Jauch. Referred to Committee on Education.

AN ACT *to create* 121.91 (4) (f) of the statutes; **relating to:** increasing a school district's revenue limit for certain expenditures for maintenance of, and technological improvements to, school district facilities.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Current law limits the increase in the total amount of revenue that a school district may receive from general school aids and property taxes. In the 1995–96 school year, the maximum allowable increase per pupil is \$200. In each school year thereafter, the maximum allowable increase per pupil is \$206. The limit is based on the difference between the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the 3 previous school years and the average of the number of pupils enrolled in the current and 2 preceding school years.

This bill increases a school district's revenue limit in any school year by the amount spent by the school district in the previous school year for maintenance of any school district facility, and the amount spent by the school district in the previous school year to develop or implement technological improvements to or in any school district facility.

The people of the state of Wisconsin, represented in senate and assembly, do enact as follows:

- **SECTION 1.** 121.91 (4) (f) of the statutes is created to read:
- 5 121.91 (4) (f) The limit otherwise applicable to a school district's revenue under
- 6 sub. (2m) in any school year is increased by an amount equal to the sum of the amount

spent by the school district in the previous school year for the maintenance of any
school district facility, and the amount spent by the school district in the previous
school year to develop or implement technological improvements to or in any school
district facility.
Section 2. Initial applicability.
(1) This act first applies to the calculation of a school district's revenue limit
