- 2 hunting parties using bows and arrows.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, any member of a group of persons hunting deer with firearms may kill a deer for another member if the 2 are within voice or visual contact of each other and if the person for whom the deer is killed has an unused deer tag. This bill expands this provision to apply to a group of persons hunting deer with bows and arrows.

- 6 individual license to hunt deer.
