AN ACT to renumber 121.02 (1) (j); to amend 118.019 (2) (intro.); and to create

118.019 (2m), 118.019 (5m), 118.019 (7) and 121.02 (1) (j) 2. of the statutes;

relating to: school district human growth and development programs and
granting rule-making authority.

Analysis by the Legislative Reference Bureau

Under current law, a school board may provide an instructional program in human growth and development in grades kindergarten to 12. If provided, the program must offer information and instruction appropriate to each grade level and the age and level of maturity of the pupils.

This bill specifies that if a program is provided, the information and instruction must be factual and medically accurate.

The bill also directs each school board that provides an instructional program in human growth and development to develop, by January 1, 1997, written policies and procedures for the selection and periodic review of materials and information for the program. By July 1, 1997, each school board must develop written policies and procedures for receiving and investigating complaints by residents of the school district regarding possible violations of the laws relating to human growth and development programs and for making determinations as to whether the laws have been violated.

Section 2. 118.019 (2m) of the statutes is created to read:

118.019 (2m) Selection of materials. By January 1, 1997, each school board that provides an instructional program in human growth and development shall adopt written policies and procedures for the selection and periodic review of materials and information for the program.

Section 3. 118.019 (5m) of the statutes is created to read:

118.019 (5m) Enforcement. By July 1, 1997, each school board that provides an instructional program in human growth and development shall adopt written policies and procedures for receiving, investigating and resolving complaints by residents of the school district regarding possible violations of this section and for making determinations as to whether this section has been violated.

SECTION 4. 118.019 (7) of the statutes is created to read:

118.019 (7) TECHNICAL ASSISTANCE; RULES. The department shall do all of the following:

- (a) Develop guidelines for and assist school boards in adopting the policies and procedures under subs. (2m) and (5m).
 - (b) Promulgate rules to administer this section.
